

# Expansion of scope means:

Adding new products, services, processes, sites, or activities to the existing certified management system.

#### Example:

- Adding a new factory site under ISO 9001 certification
- Including a new service line under ISO 27001 certification
- Expanding from local operations to international operations under the same certification

# When Does Scope Expansion Occur?

- · Organization begins new operations or processes under the same management system.
- · Client requests certification to additional standards or codes.
- · Business growth requiring alignment of new activities with certified processes.
- Regulatory or customer requirements mandating scope extension.

# Step-by-Step Expansion of Certification Scope Process

#### Step 1: Client Request

- The client formally requests scope expansion to the Certification Body (CB), indicating:
  - Details of the new activities, products, or sites.
  - Processes involved and their locations.
  - · Relevant documents reflecting scope expansion (updated manuals, procedures)

#### Step 2: Document Review

- The CB reviews:
  - Updated scope statement.
  - Management system documentation related to the new scope.
  - Risk assessments and controls applied to the new scope.



## Step 3: Quotation and Agreement

- · CB issues a quotation for the scope expansion audit.
- A revised agreement/addendum may be signed.

## Step 4: Planning the Scope Expansion Audit

- CB assesses whether:
  - An on-site audit is required.
  - It can be combined with the next surveillance audit.
  - · Partial audits or documentation reviews are sufficient for minor expansions.

### Step 5: Conducting the Audit

- · CB auditors verify:
  - · Implementation of the management system in the expanded scope area.
  - Compliance with ISO requirements within the new processes/sites.
  - · Integration of new processes with existing management system controls.
  - Employee competence and awareness in the new scope area.

### Step 6: Handling Non-Conformities

- If NCs are found:
  - · The client must submit root cause analysis and corrective actions.
  - Major NCs must be closed before approving the scope expansion.

### Step 7: Certification Review and Decision

- The CB's technical reviewer verifies:
  - · Adequacy of the audit for the expanded scope.
  - Closure of any NCs.
  - Continued compliance with ISO requirements.
- Decision options
  - Approve scope expansion
  - · Request additional information or actions
  - · Reject expansion if requirements are not fulfilled

#### Step 8: Issuance of Updated Certificate

- Upon approval:
  - A revised certificate is issued reflecting the expanded scope.
  - The scope description on the certificate and CB register is updated.
  - The client may now publicly claim the expanded certification scope.

#### Step 8: Issuance of Updated Certificate

  - A revised certificate is issued reflecting the expanded scope.

  - · The client may now publicly claim the expanded certification scope.



# **Key Considerations**

- Expansion must align with the current management system and its controls.
- · New processes/sites must demonstrate compliance and effective implementation.
- All relevant statutory and regulatory requirements must be considered.
- Expansion audits are chargeable and planned based on the complexity of the expansion

## Benefits of Scope Expansion

- · Aligns certification with growing business needs.
- Enhances credibility with customers for new services/products.
- · Maintains integrated certification across multiple sites and activities.
- Supports compliance with evolving market and regulatory demands.
