KEY TRANSITION HIGHLIGHTS

- Climate Change & Biodiversity Organizations must now explicitly consider climate risks, biodiversity, and supply chain impacts in their EMS scope (Clause 4).
- Leadership Accountability Stronger focus on top management responsibility and ethical, transparent decision-making (Clause 5).
- Planning for Change A new clause on Change Management (6.3) ensures organizations can handle internal and external changes effectively.
- Supplier & Operational Control Greater emphasis on managing suppliers, outsourced processes, and emergency preparedness (Clause 8).
- Performance & Management Review More structured reviews and clearer expectations to measure real environmental performance, not just compliance (Clause 9).
- Continual Improvement Stronger requirements for corrective actions and proactive learning (Clause 10).
- Annex A Guidance Expanded explanations for easier implementation and clearer audits.

TRANSITION CHANGES AHEAD

The International Organization for Standardization (ISO) is finalizing the next revision of ISO 14001:2026, the globally recognized Environmental Management System (EMS) standard. This new version will replace ISO 14001:2015 and is expected to be published in early 2026.
